I AM AN ENGINEER. In my profession I take deep pride, but without vainglory; to it I owe solemn obligations that I am eager to fulfill.

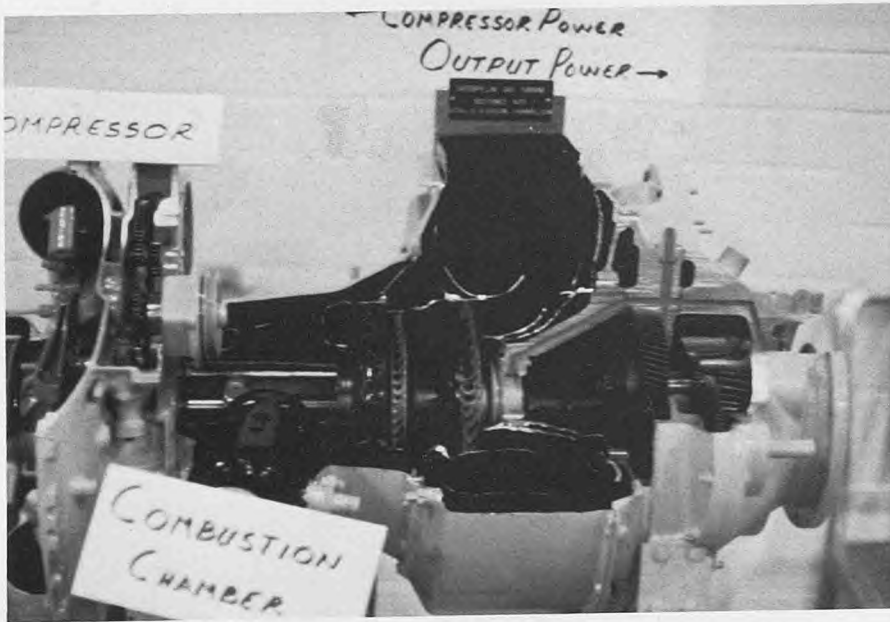
As an Engineer, I will participate in none but honest enterprise. To him that has engaged my services, as employer or client, I will give the utmost of performance and fidelity.

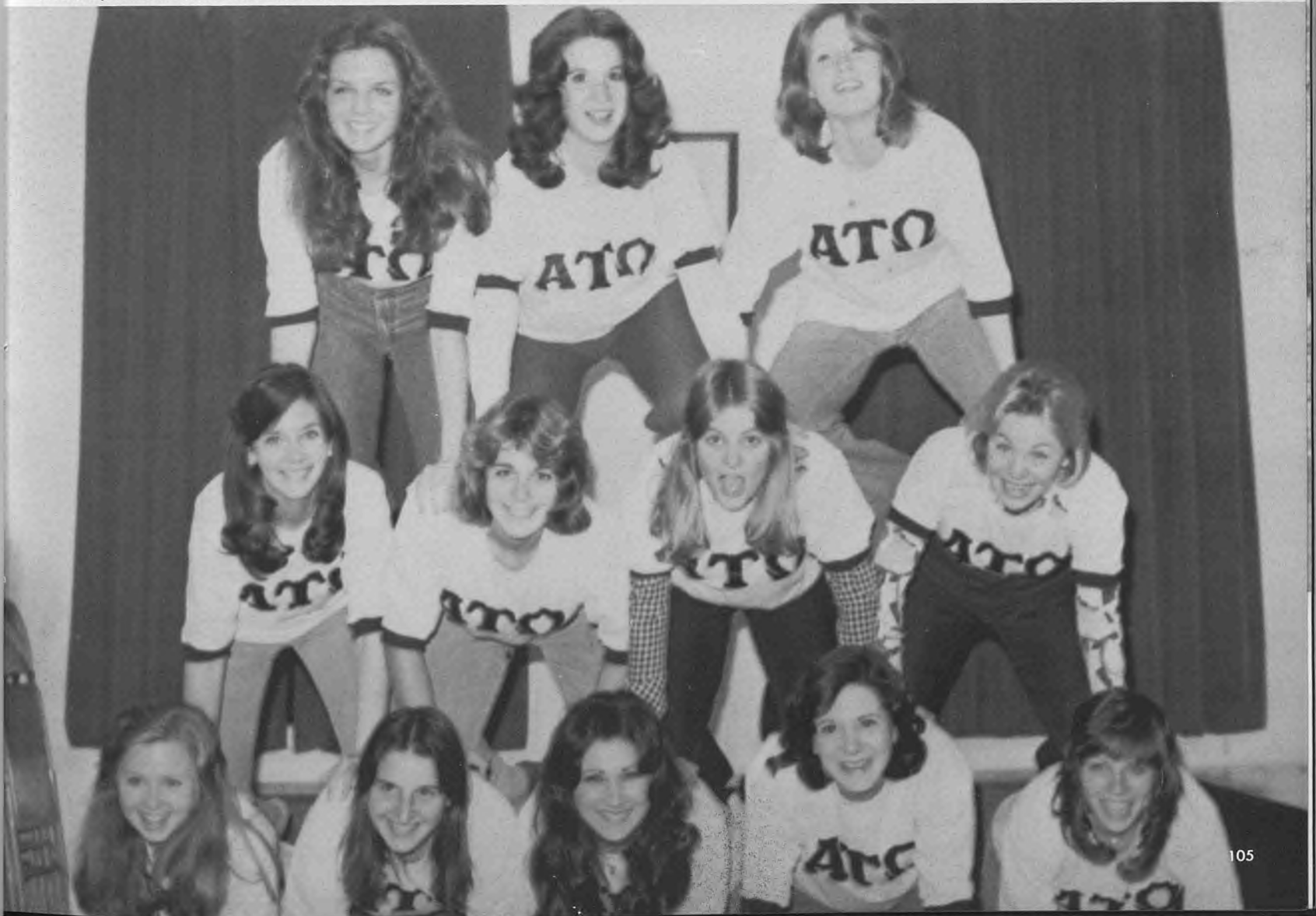
Little Sisters of the Maltese Cross

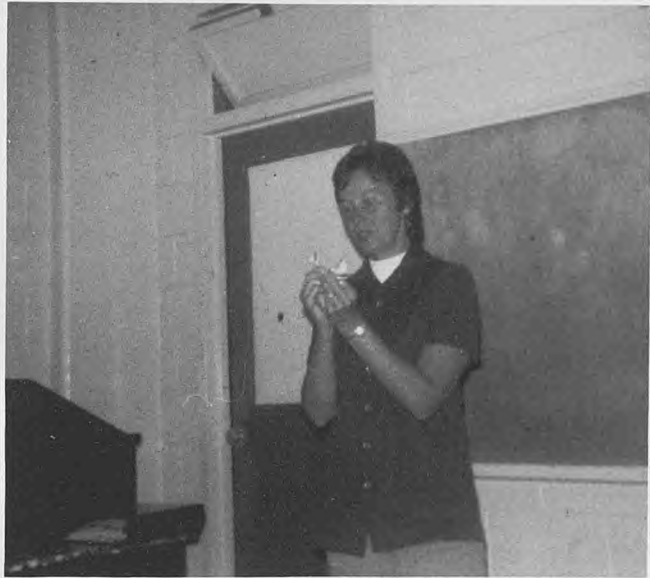

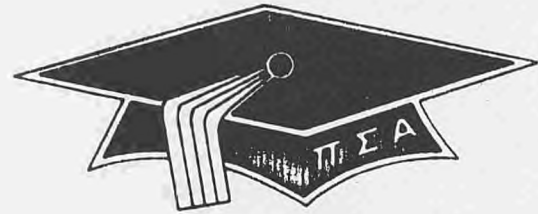

Fraternity members are chosen from male students in the College of Administration and Business who have a grade point average higher than the overall men's average in that college.

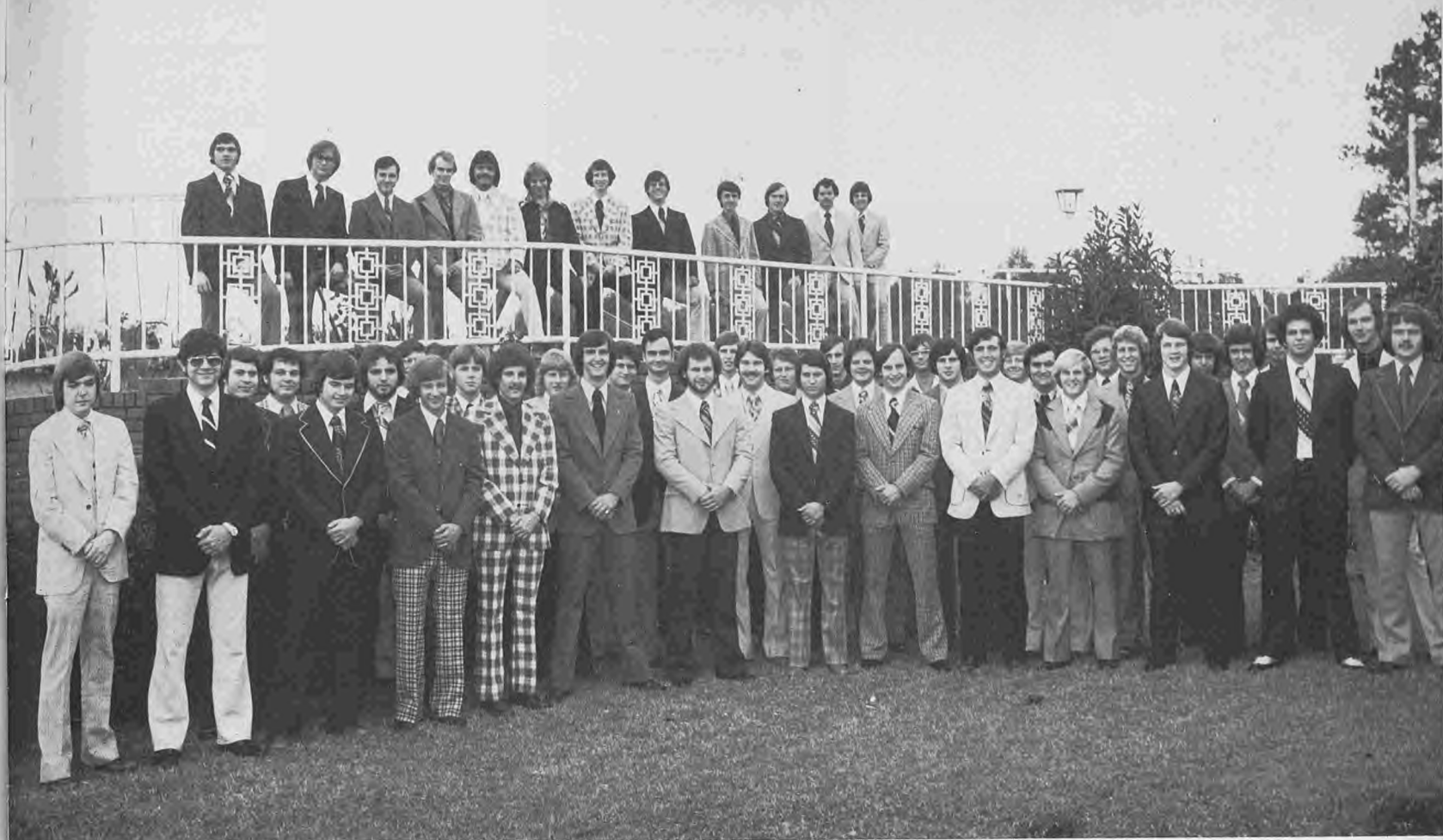

Pi Tau Sigma

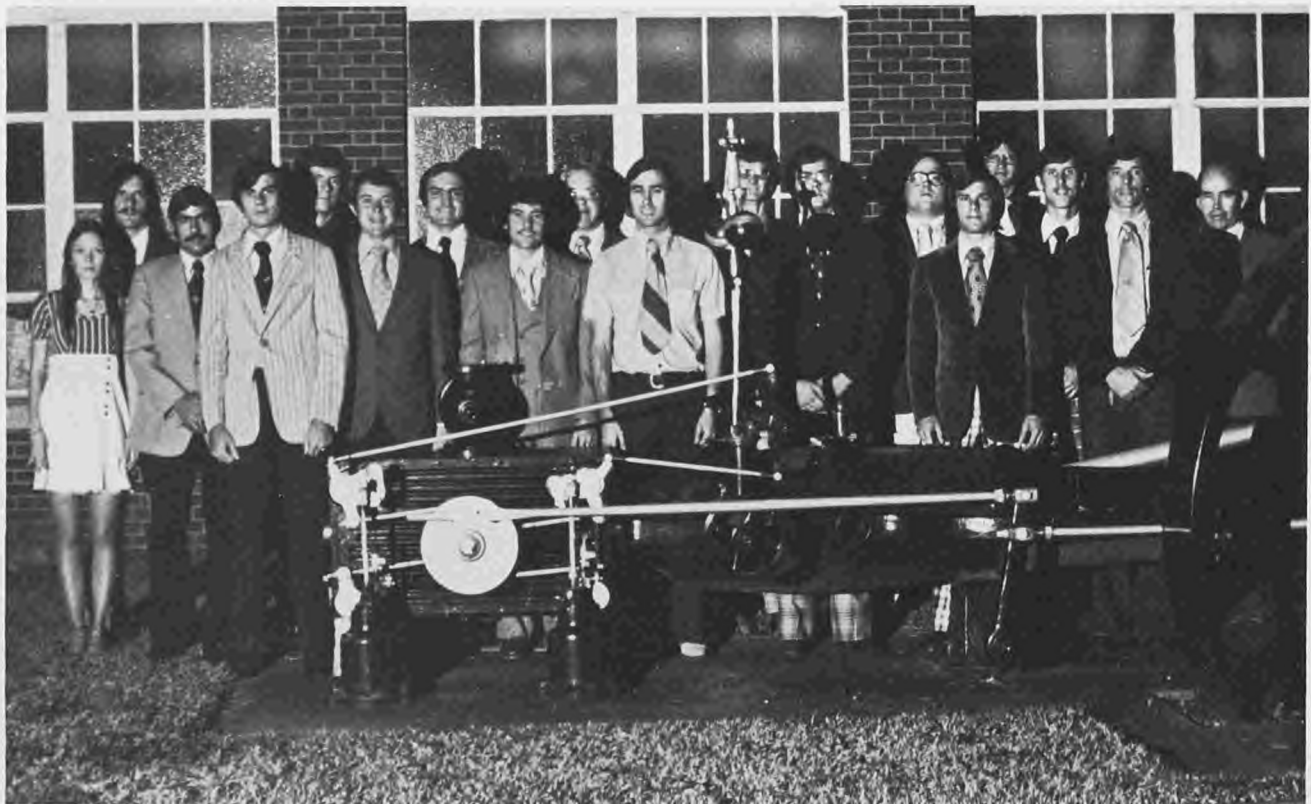

Tech head mentor Maxie Lambright was a little worried about the passing game, but Steve Haynes gave him reason to change his mind.

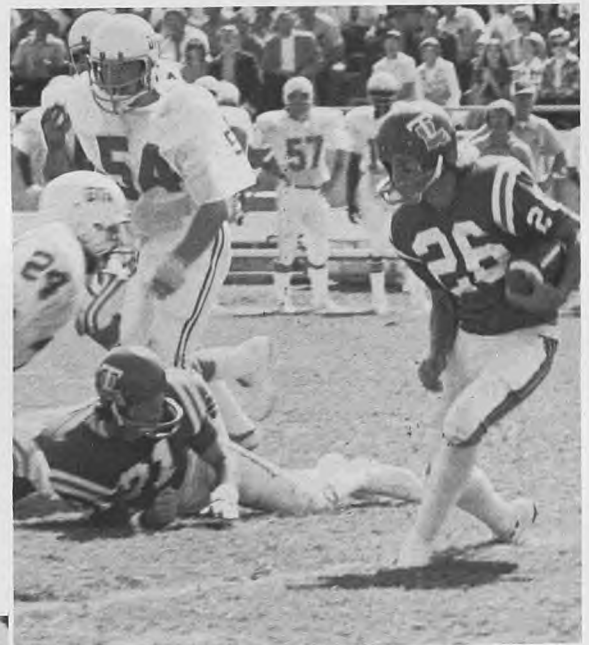
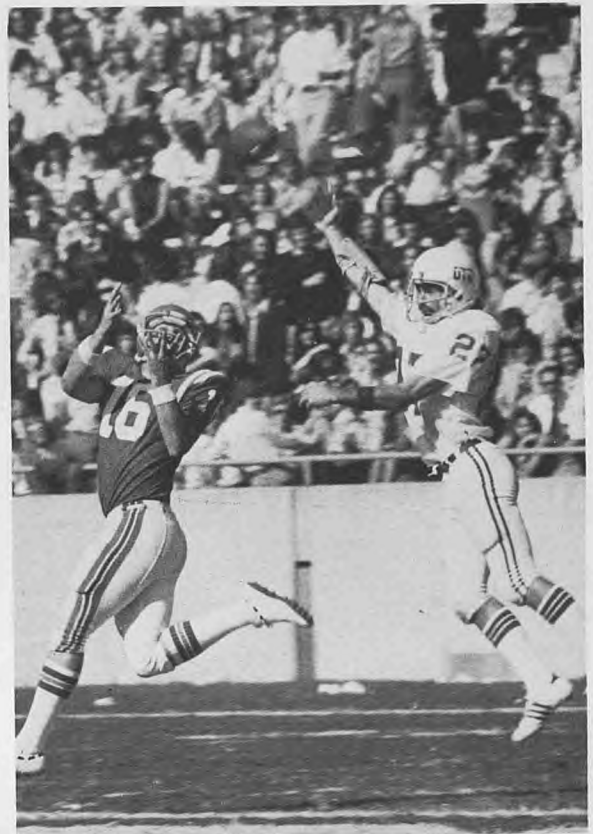
Haynes tossed the football 13 times and completed 12 for 302 yards, for a 92.3 completion percentage. The percentage broke Terry Bradshaw's 1969 record in one game which was 90.0 which he set against Chattanooga after completing 9 of 10 passes.

The 'Dogs had a great day on offense while also having an excellent day on defense. The offense rolled up 510 yards total offense while noseguard Rodney Bagley was named the "defensive player of the game" for the second game in a row.

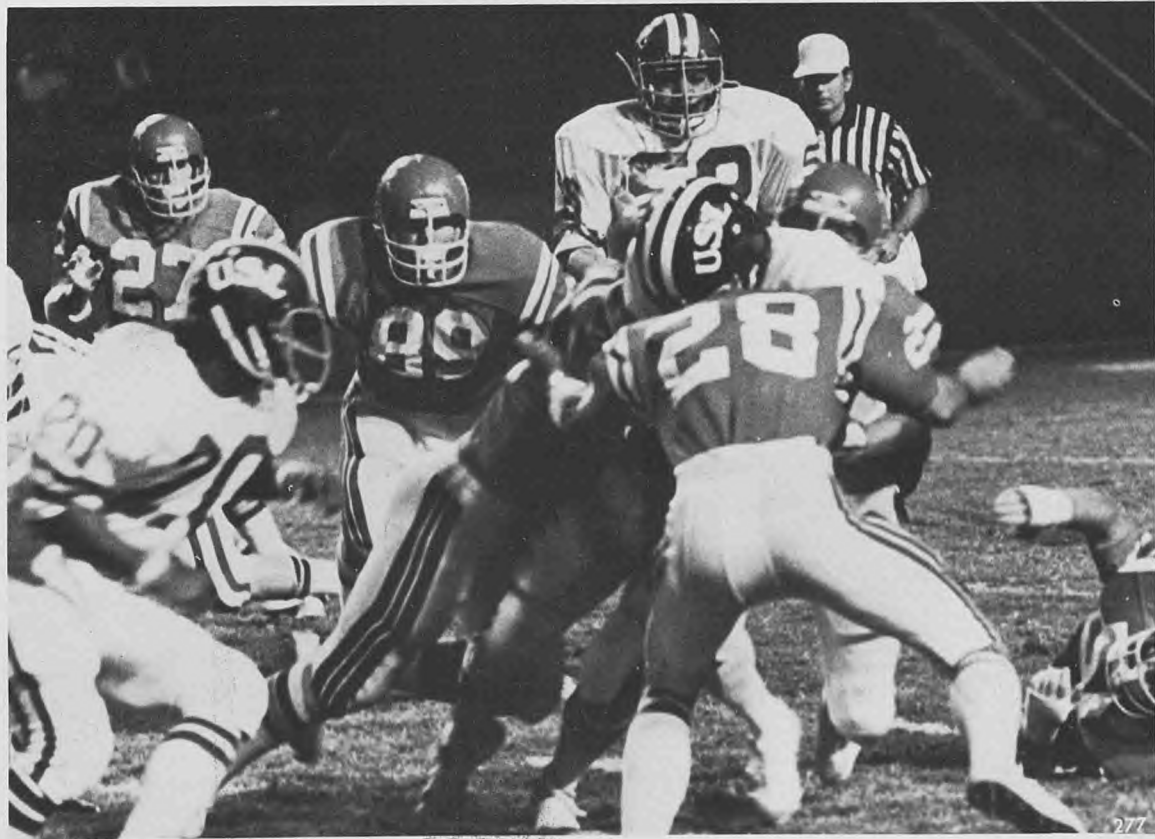
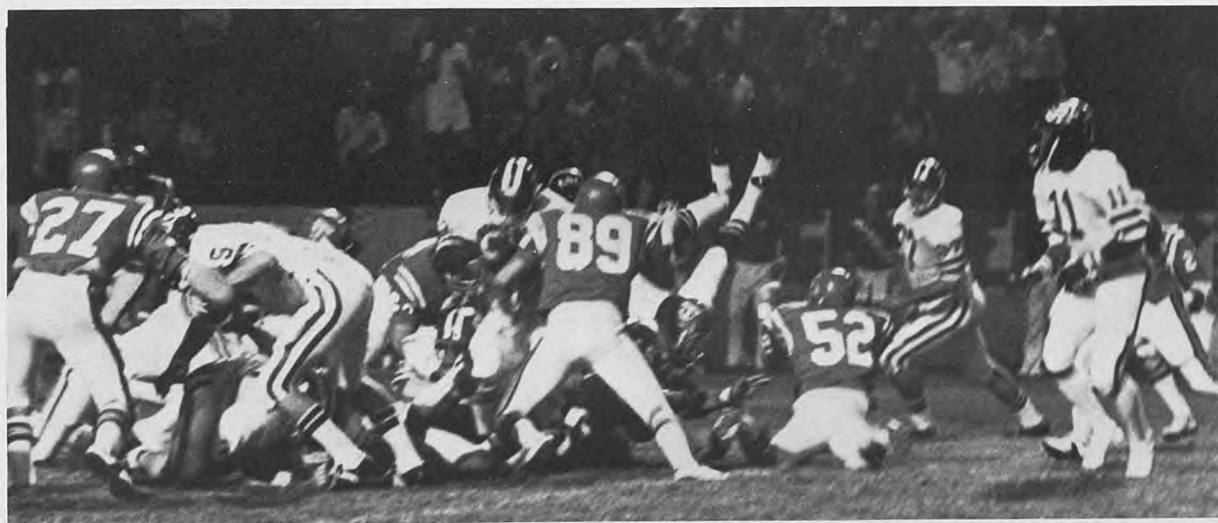
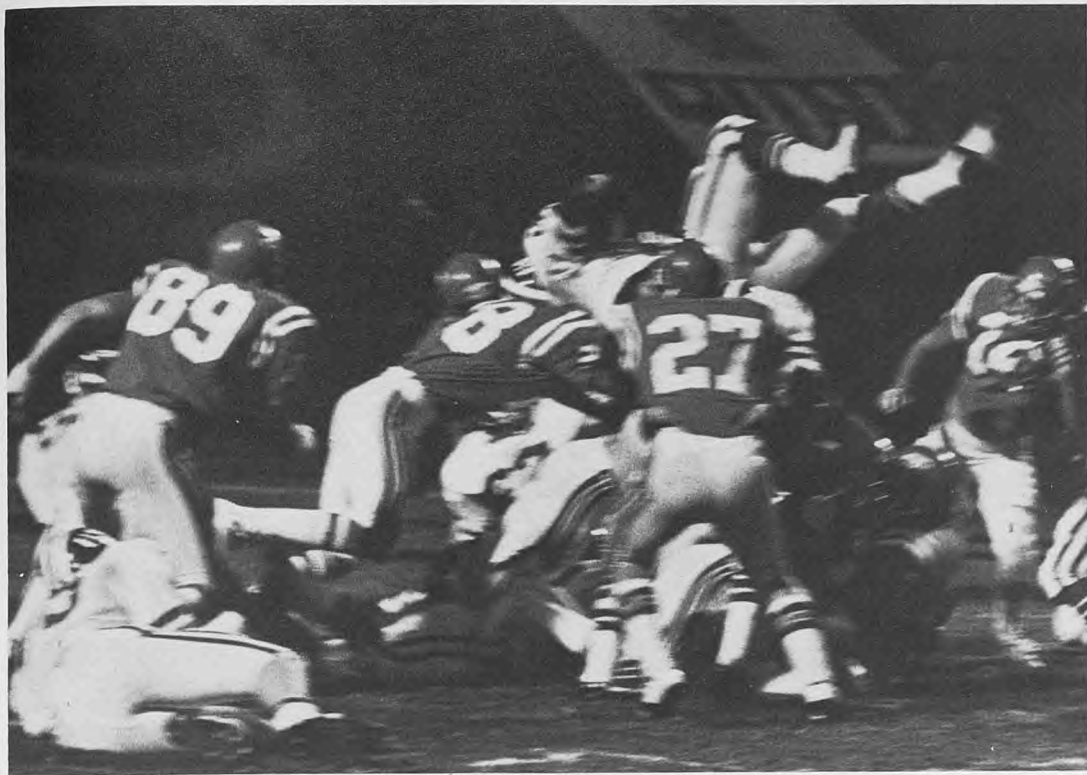
top 10 in the nation in that category.

Tech used its four main sources to win. The passing of Randy Robertson, the running of Arry Moody and John Henry White, a stout defense and a good kicking game.

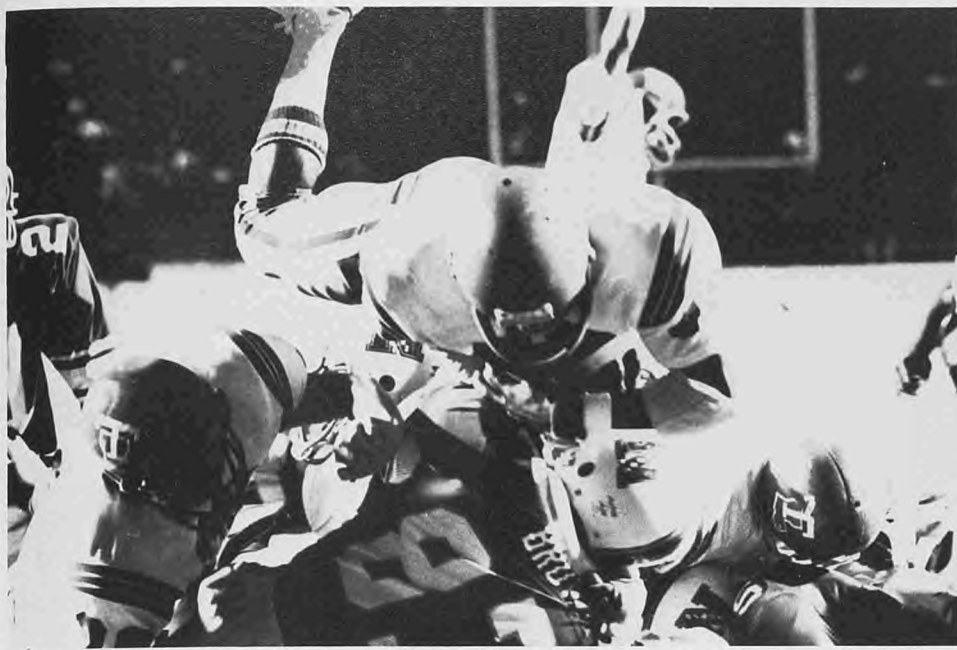

Rodney Bagley and Eddie Anglin spearheaded the defensive effort with Bagley getting 13 tackles and Anglin nine.

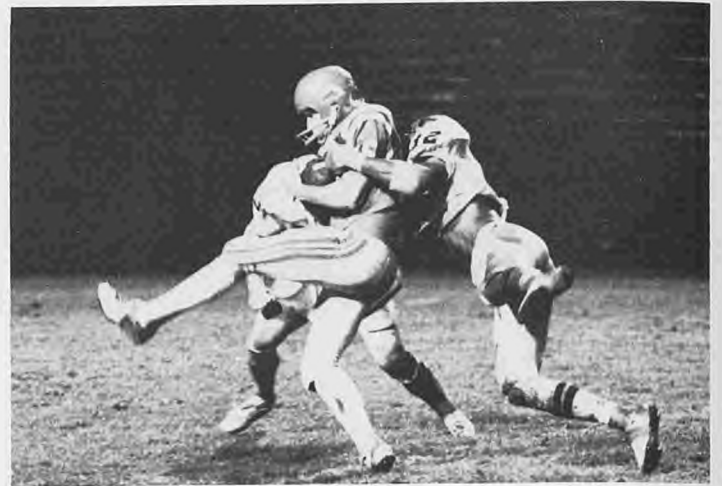

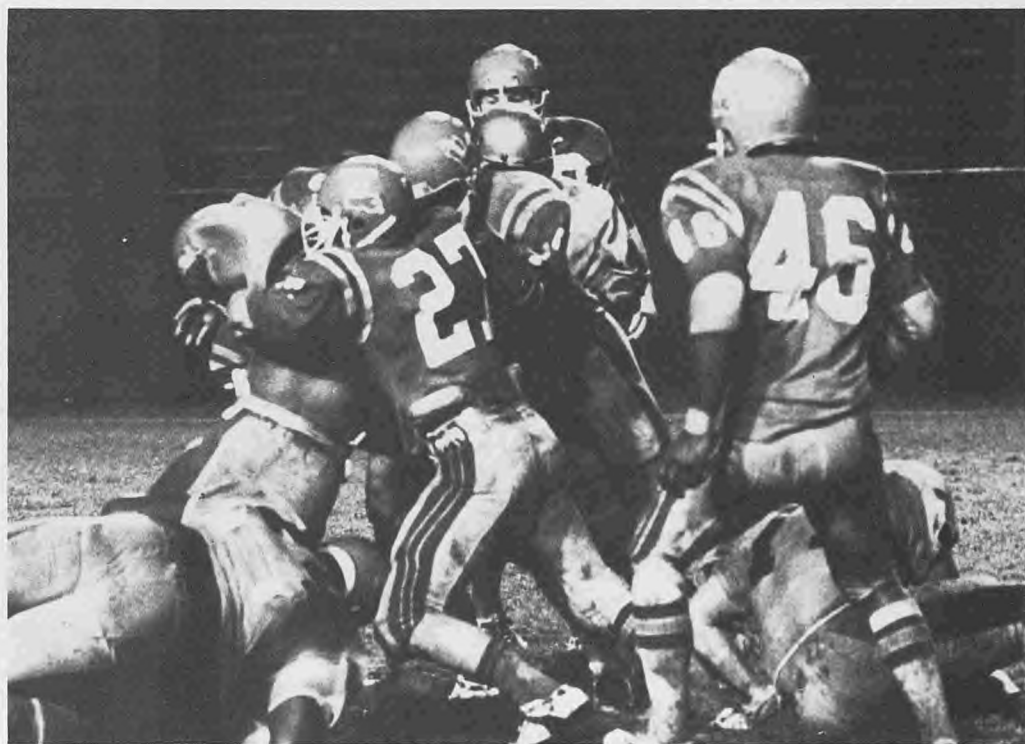

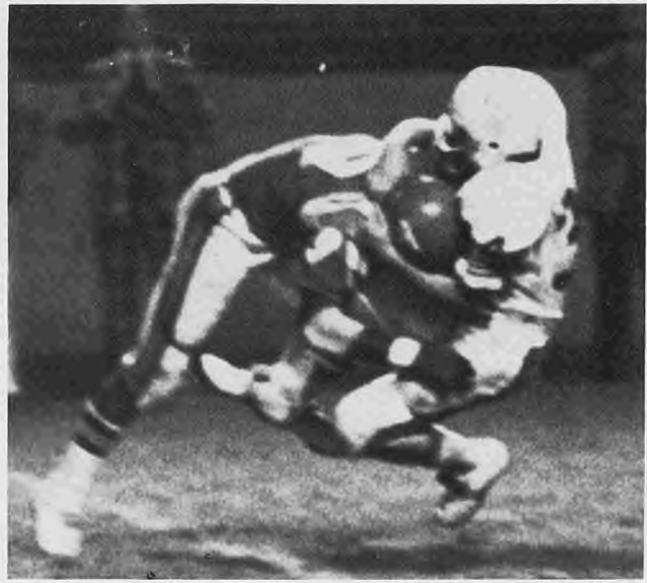
Arry Moody led the scoring for the night by scoring three touchdowns including a 41 yard pass from the "other" quarterback, Randy Robertson.

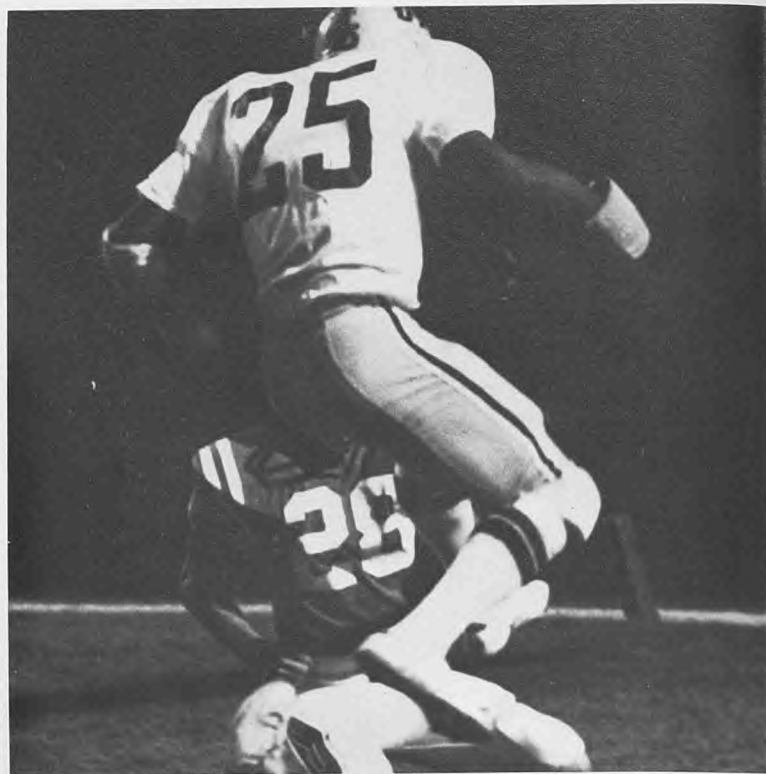

Arkansas State's vaunted ground game was too much for the smaller Tech defense as the Indians rolled up 376 yards on the ground.

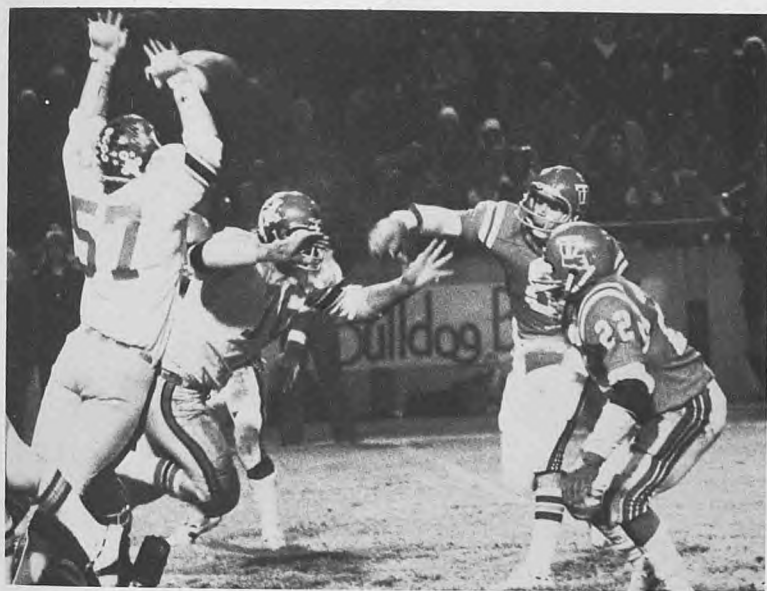
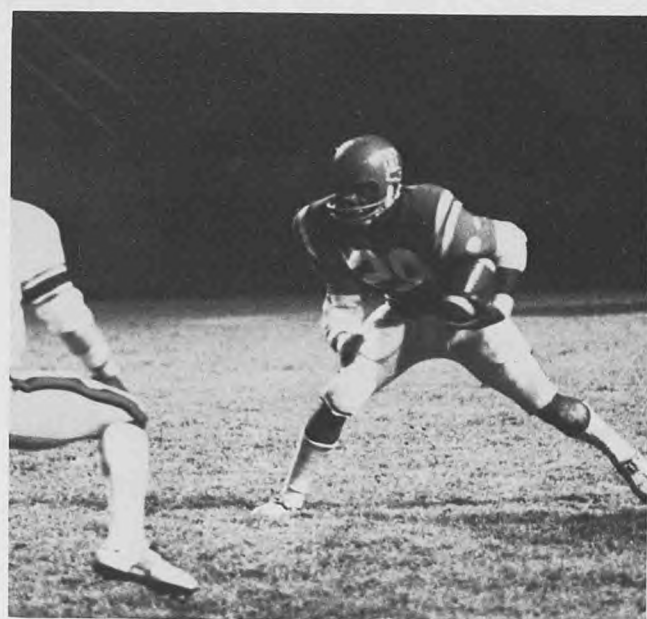

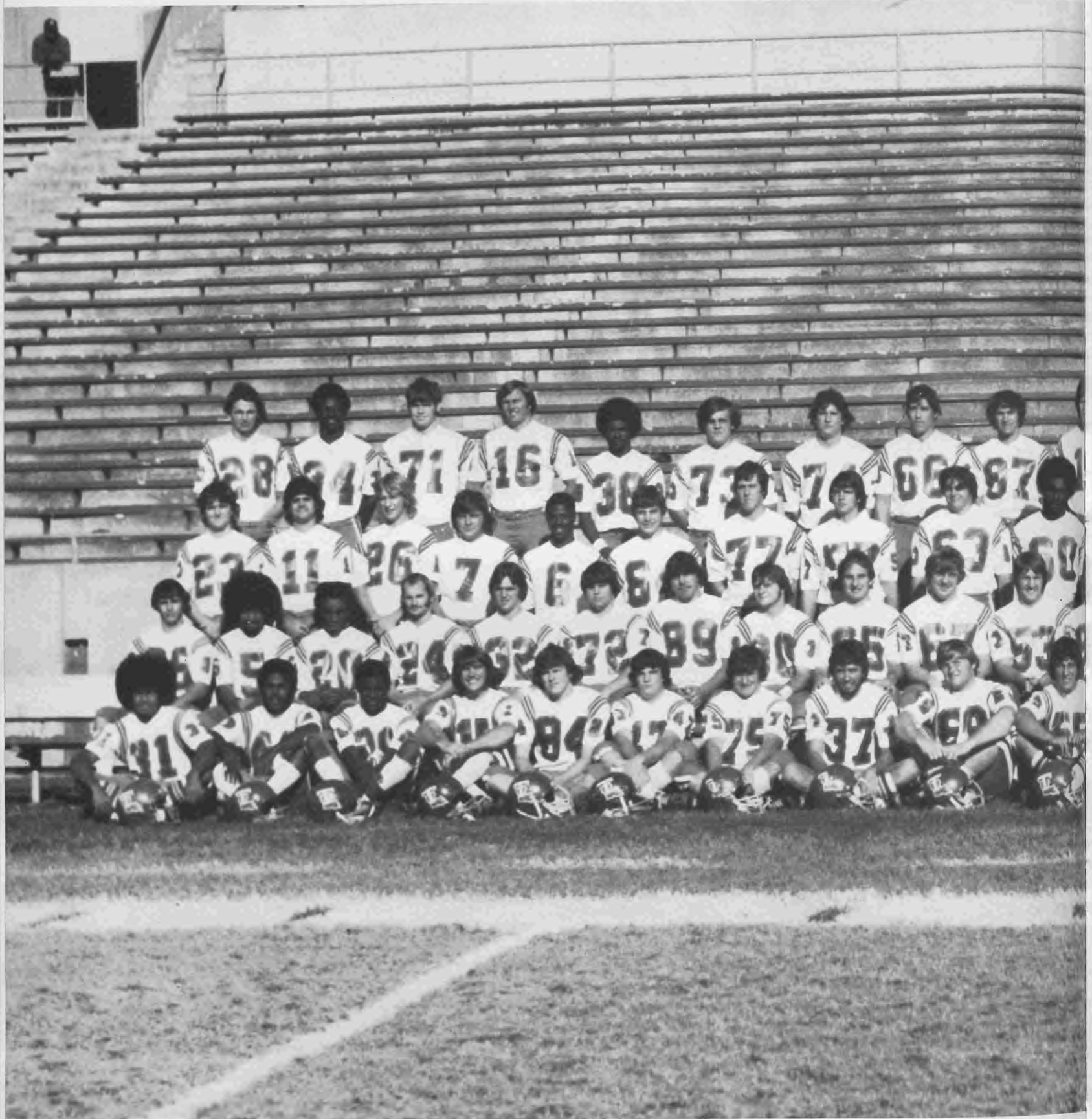
Tilley was one of 10 Bulldog seniors, all of whom started the game, who wound up playing on teams that compiled a 43-4 record over the years.

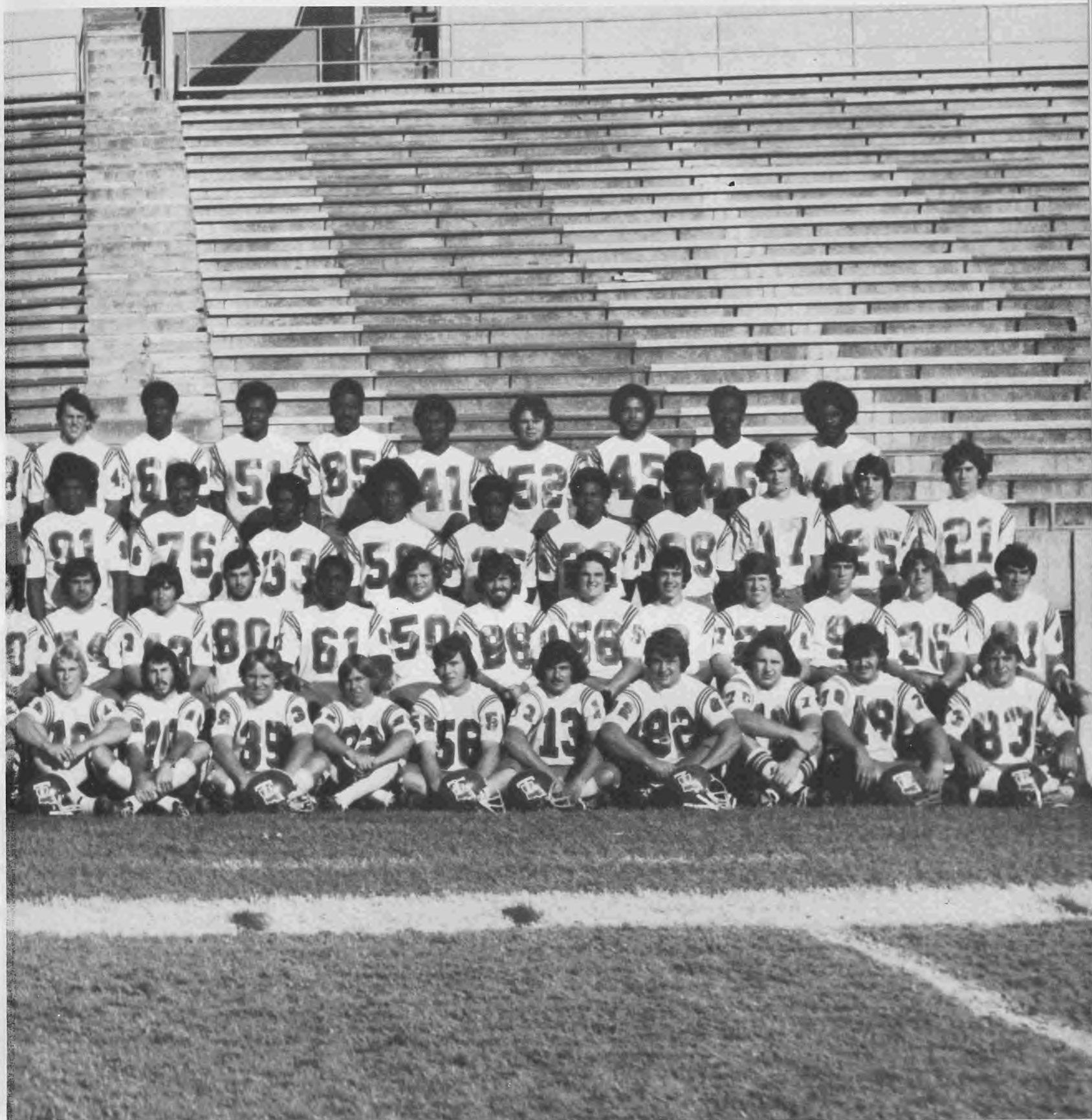

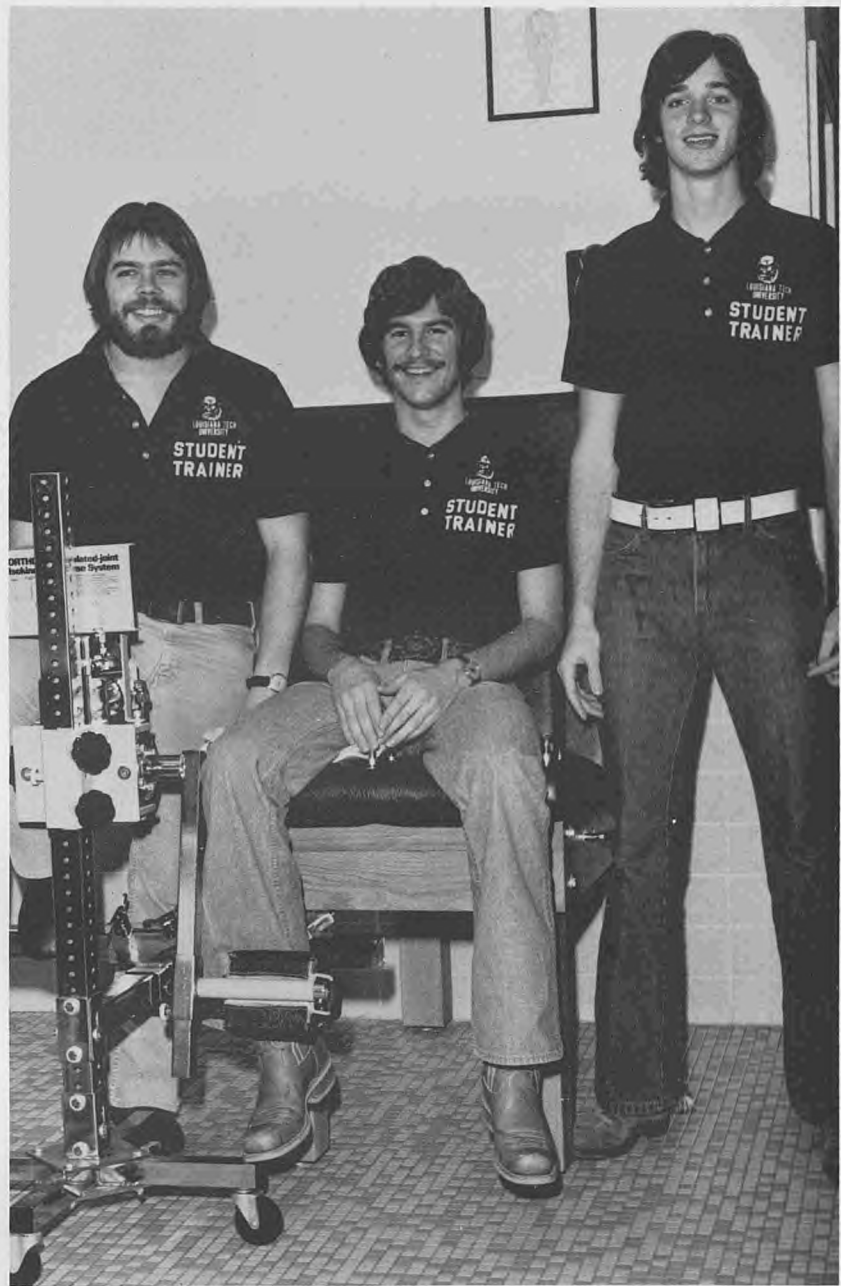

Basketball: Rebuilding Into a Conference Championship

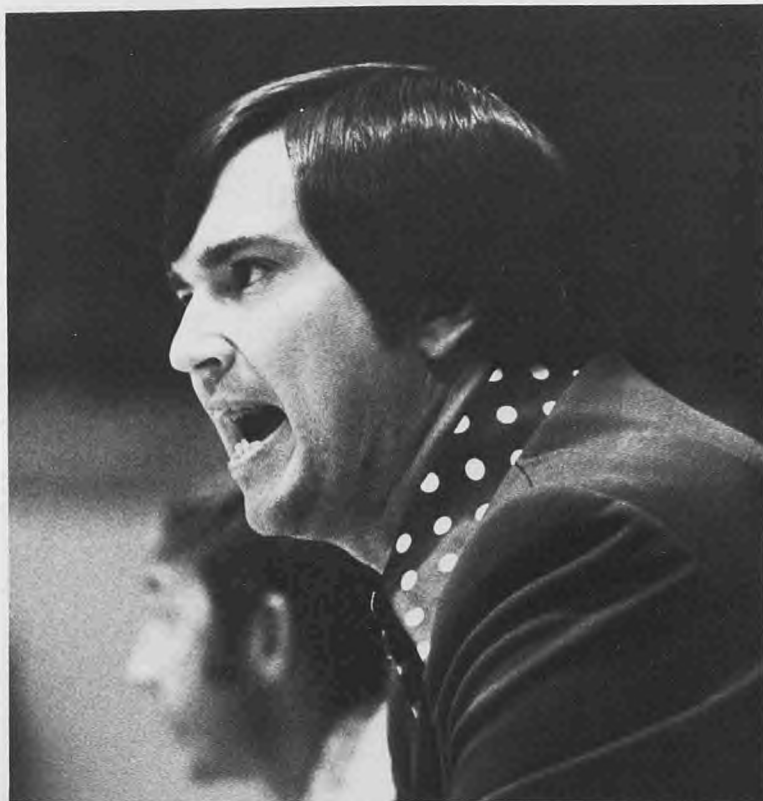

Coed Basketeers End Good Season; 3 Make All-State

Louisiana Tech's women basketball players, in their second year of competition, produced a 17-8 regular season record as they headed into the state tournament of the Louisiana Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women held in New Orleans.

At the double elimination tourney, Tech acquired the distinction of having three of its participants placed on the All-State team. They were Mandy Warren, Mickie DeMoss and Kay Ford.

In the opening round of the state meet, Tech defeated Southwestern Louisiana, 84-62. The Techsters later trounced Northeast Louisiana, 69-64. They were set back by Northwestern Louisiana, 83-80, and by Louisiana State, 85-77, to wind up in fourth place. Tech's results for the year were 19 wins and 10 losses.

Southeastern Louisiana, last year's title winners, retained the championship by trimming LSU, 89-85.

Among the 1975-76 wins for Coach Sonja Hogg's girls were three straight at Natchitoches, where they won the Northwestern State tournament.



Baseball '75

Louisiana Tech's baseball team finished another impressive year under Coach Pat Patterson in the spring of 1975. The Bulldogs finished in a first-place tie with Lamar for the Southland Conference crown after regular play. Tech then went on to beat Lamar in a best-of-five playoff series to determine the NCAA representative in the South Central Regional Tournament in Arlington, Texas. Tech opened the tournament against the University of Texas, the eventual national champions, and lost by a score of 6-2 when the Longhorns put up a five-run late inning outburst.

Coach Patterson was named "Coach of the Year" in the conference while guiding his team to an overall 32-15 season. Coach Patterson has led his baseball crew to three league titles and an overall 215-140 record in his eight years as coach for a .606 winning percentage.

Leading the team in almost every offensive category was catcher Richie McAlister. McAlister led in average with a .387 mark and hits with 55. He only struck out nine times in 142 at-bats while leading the team with 37 bases on balls. McAlister led the Southland Conference in almost every category, also. He hit an unbelievable .510 while getting 17 RBIs in conference play. McAlister in all broke 28 Tech and Southland Conference records during his four years at Tech.

Another record performance was put in by pitcher Randy McGilberry. McGilberry broke two seasonal standards by winning 12 games and losing only four and pitching in 115 innings.

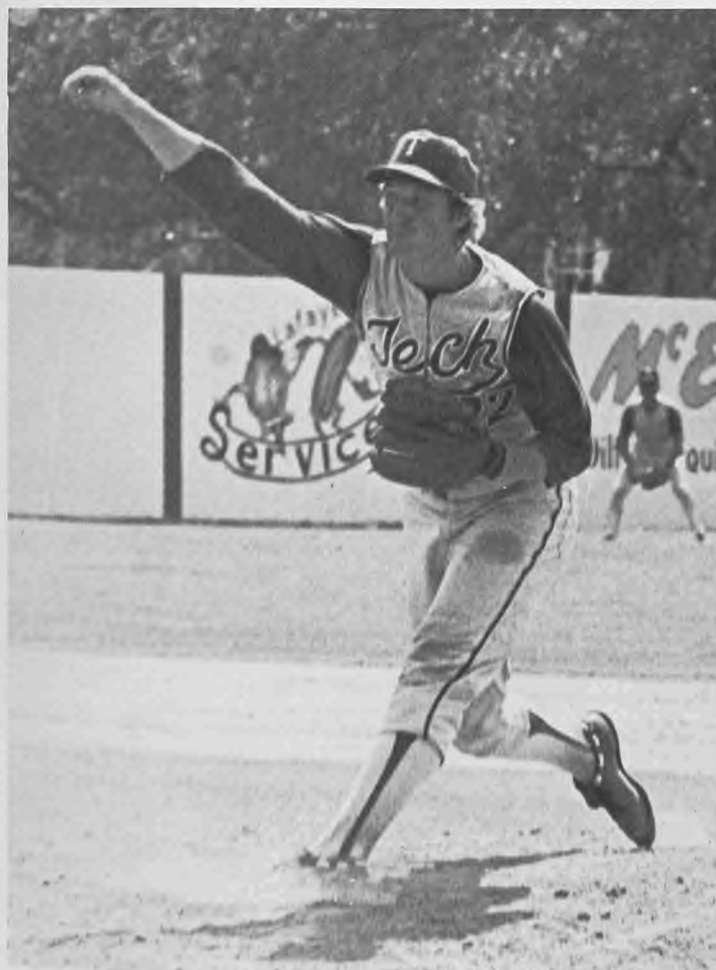
Other impressive performances were put in by pitchers Rodney Howard and Ronald Martin as they finished up with 7-3 and 8-3 records, respectively.

Junior shortstop Steve Lacy finished up another steady year with a .280 batting average and 21 RBIs. First baseman Barry Johnson was first on the team in RBIs with 37 and second on the team in hitting with a .333 mark.



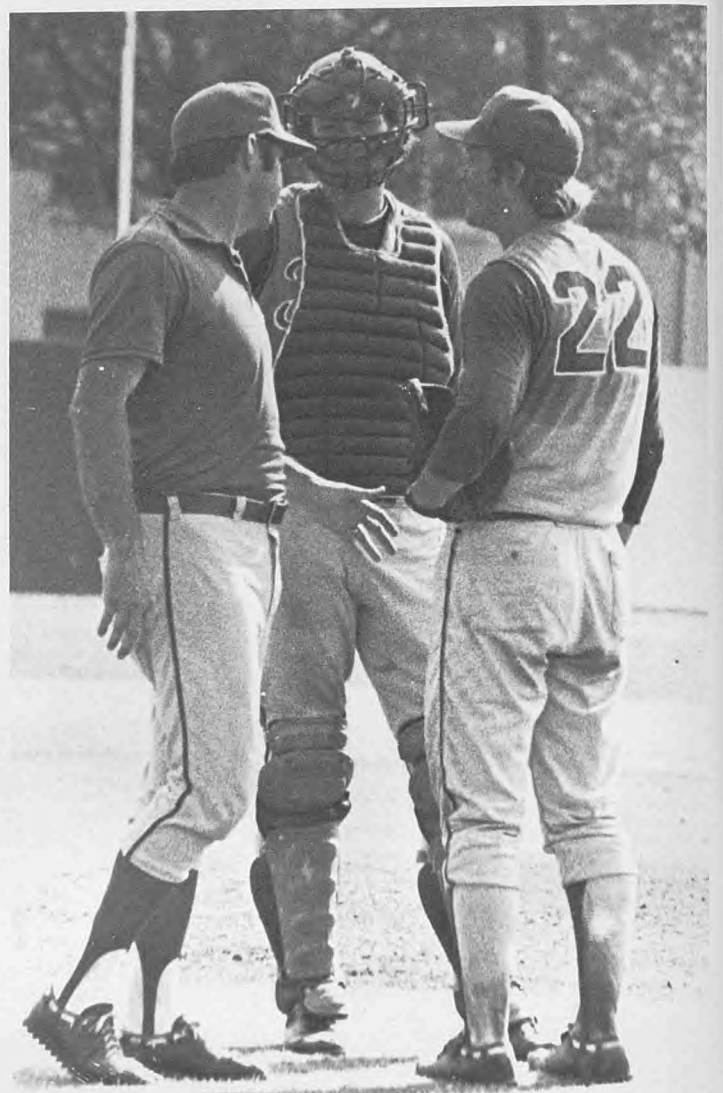

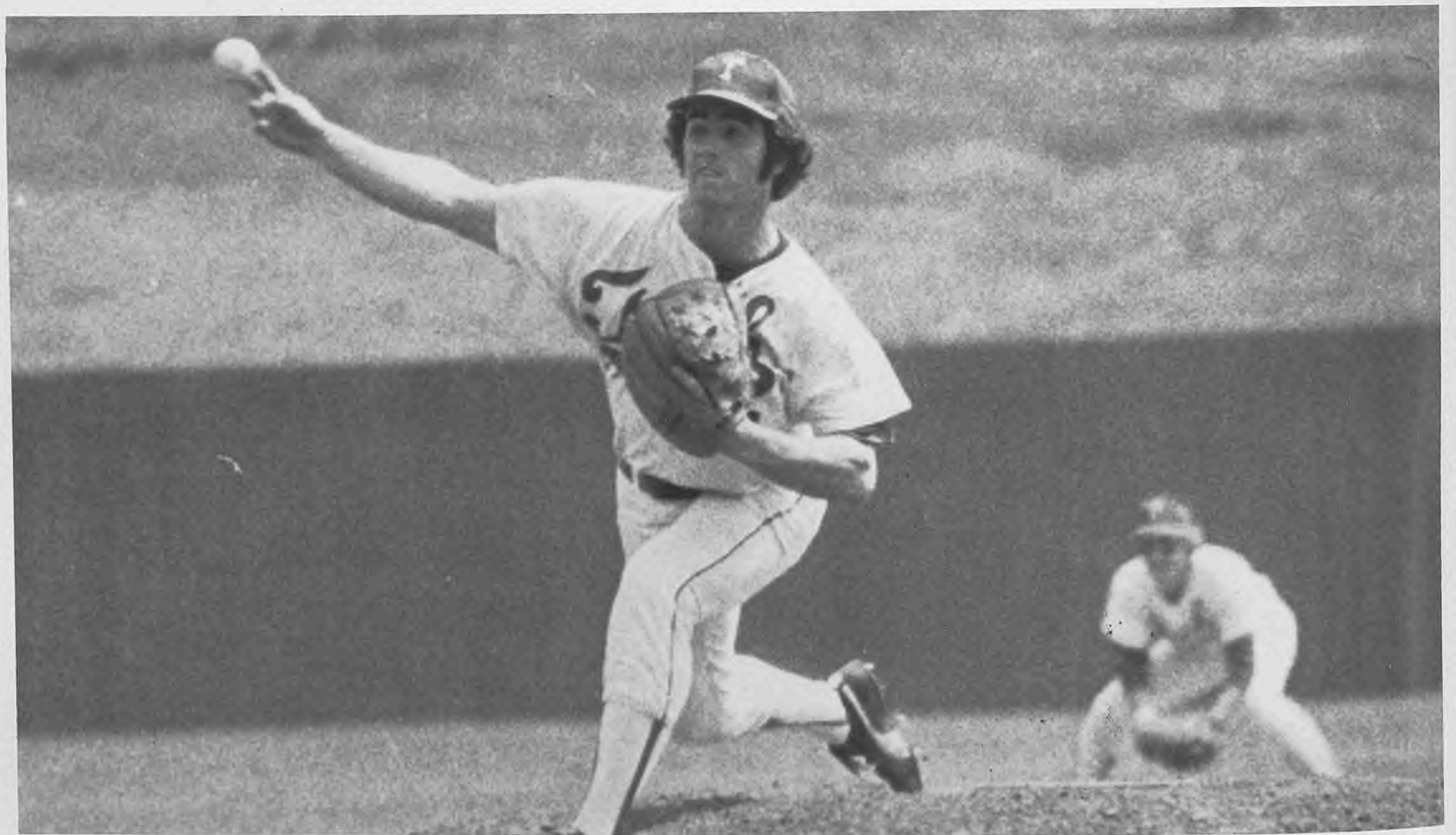

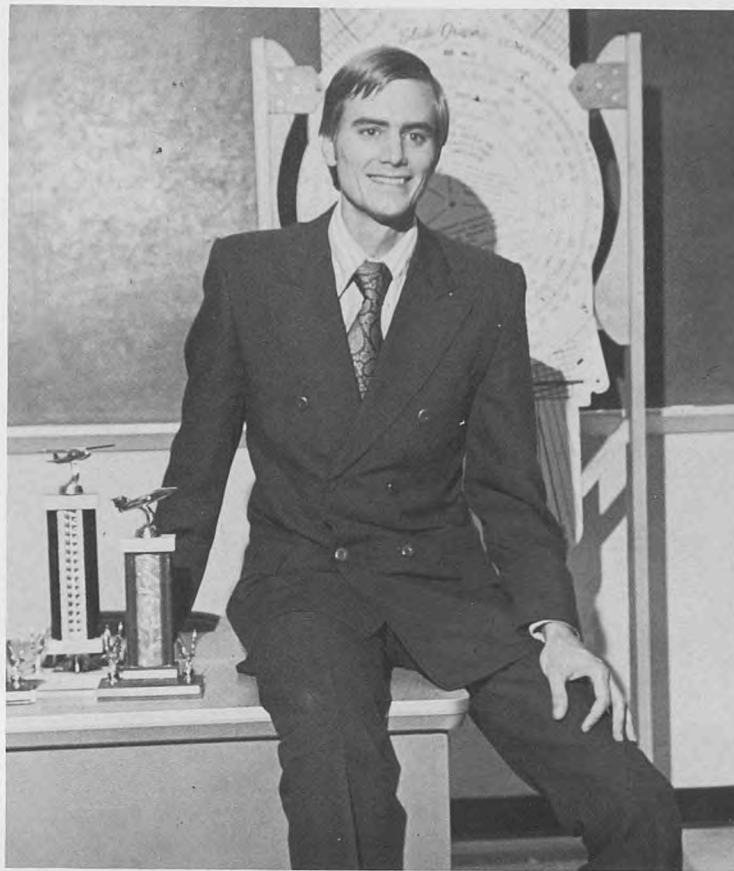


Flight Team

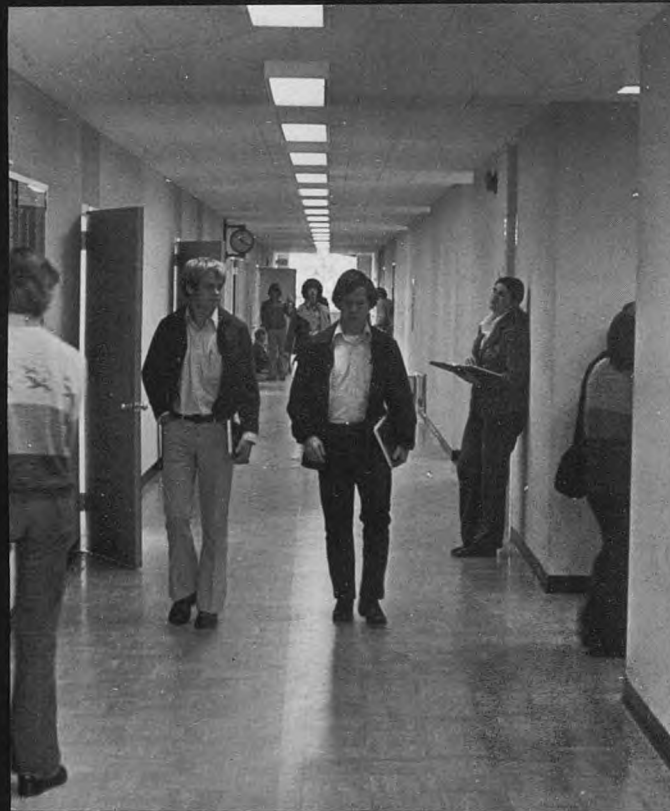
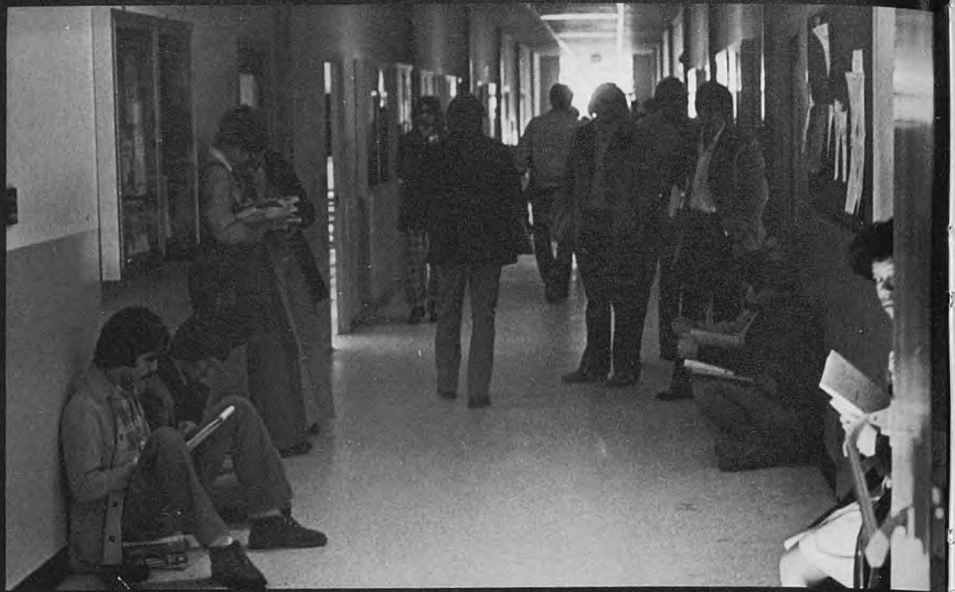
